


Main Street Westbank circa 1920.




From the Kitchen Nook: Cherry Pie by Rita Pedersen

Ingredients: 4 cups cherries, pitted; 1 cup sugar (1 1/4 cups for sour cherries); 1/4 cup flour; 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon; pastry for a double-crust 9-inch pie. Directions: Mix ingredients for filling. Place in pastry-lined pie pan. Put top crust on. Cut vent slits in top crust, and flute edges. Brush with milk and sprinkle with sugar. Bake at 425°F for 25 minutes; reduce heat to 350°F and bake for 25-30 minutes more. Tip: put sugar, flour and cinnamon in a large zip-loc bag. Add the cherries and toss to coat. This coats them more evenly than prepar-

ing the mixture in a bowl and the filling is firmer. Serves 8.

Sheila Paynter...born and raised in the Okanagan! Part II by Gordon Ficke

"Henry was a beekeeper as well," Sheila stated. "He learned the art of bee keeping as a very young lad while he was still living in England; and, he caught his first swarm when he was 11 years old." Henry would take various courses from time to time to keep himself abreast of the latest bee keeping information.

"As a mature student I took a course in early childhood education," Sheila related. Esther Reece had opened the first kindergarten in Westbank. I joined her and taught for seven years. I enjoyed teaching those children." Sheila used that opportunity to take her students to visit the farm every spring. Hundreds of other kindergarten children got a taste of what farm life was like and what it entails. "That was in the days before seat belt regulations," Paynter admitted. "Back then you could transport all the children to the farm in a number of cars."

Henry and Sheila have six children. Geoffrey was born in 1947, Gillian in 1948, Farlie in 1949, Henry in 1951, David in 1952 and Alisen in 1953.

"All six of our children went away for training and travelling," Sheila remarked. "However, they all returned to Westbank to farm, which is quite unusual!" Amazingly, Henry was still farming until his death in 2005 at age 98! The original farm property is now divided amongst the six children.

"I have been writing a certain amount all my life," Sheila stated. "In 1988, for no reason, I had the desire to hike through Wild Horse Canyon." Not only did her dream come to fruition in 1990, but also expanded the initial hike to include the entire 270-kilometre shoreline around Okanagan Lake! She walked for 24 days and got lost twice, however her goal was accomplished. Sheila documented her experiences in her first book, entitled "First Time Around." She enjoyed that first experience so much that she decided to circumnavigate Okanagan Lake two years later in a 12 foot aluminum row boat. Sheila shared those experiences with her audience in her second book, "Second Time Around," written in 1994.

Paynter also enjoys playing an occasional round of golf and has played every golf course in the Okanagan Valley that has a view of the lake. Consequently, she wrote her third book in 1996 entitled, "Okanagan Golf Points of View." Sheila still writes a monthly column for the Westside Weekly.

Sheila is blessed with good health and still lives in her family home, built by her husband Henry and Art Johnson in 1951.
