From the Kitchen Nook: Zucchini Gratin by Rita Pedersen

Ingredients: 2 zucchini, cut into 1/4-inch-thick slices, 2 plum tomatoes, thinly sliced, 1/2 cup finely chopped red onions, 1/4 cup Italian dressing, 2 tblsp. chopped fresh basil, 3/4 cup shredded cheese. HEAT oven to 425°F. ARRANGE 4 rows of zucchini alternately with 3 rows of tomatoes on bottom of 9-inch square baking dish oiled, overlapping rows as necessary. Sprinkle with onions; drizzle with dressing. Cover. BAKE 30 to 35 minutes or until zucchini is tender, uncovering after 20 minutes. TOP with basil and cheese; bake 5 minutes or until cheese is melted. Add extra colour by preparing with a mixture of green and

yellow zucchini.

Westbank gets Irrigation Water...the Dawn of a New Era! Part II by Gordon H. Ficke

During the unusually dry summer of 1924, the Westbank Irrigation District's main water supply ran out. The Trustees moved "that we get a pair of rubber boots, a bucksaw and twenty sticks of powder for Mr. Paynter." Edwin trudged up to Paynter Lake with his supplies and blew up the beaver dam that obstructed the flow of water from that lake, thus providing enough water for the orchardists to save their harvest.

In 1942 Edwin's son Henry Oliver enlisted for World War II and Edwin accepted his elder son's duties as Irrigation Secretary until relinquishing his position on the board on February 29th, 1964. At that 1964 Westbank Irrigation District's A.G.M. Edwin Coleman Paynter received a tribute letter for his 43 years of continuous service to the W.I.D. and was presented a gold watch on the occasion of his retirement in appreciation for a good job done. When Henry Paynter's son Geoffrey was on the board of the Westbank Irrigation District from 1974 to 1981, the original ditches and flumes were replaced in twelve months, with pipes laid underground to prevent evaporation.

David Paynter was on the Westbank Irrigation District board for 21 years. He also served as Chairman of the board. David revealed, "We were always working for the future. When we went up into the bush, we were on the lookout for ravines and gullies. If it was summer we would see if there was any water running down them into a lake. If it was winter we would be up there on snowmobiles and still had water on our minds." During David Paynter's tenure on the board, Tadpole Lake was added to the drainage system for W.I.D.

Three generations of the Paynter family have been on the Westbank Irrigation Board. What a wonderful legacy to leave for Westbank!
