

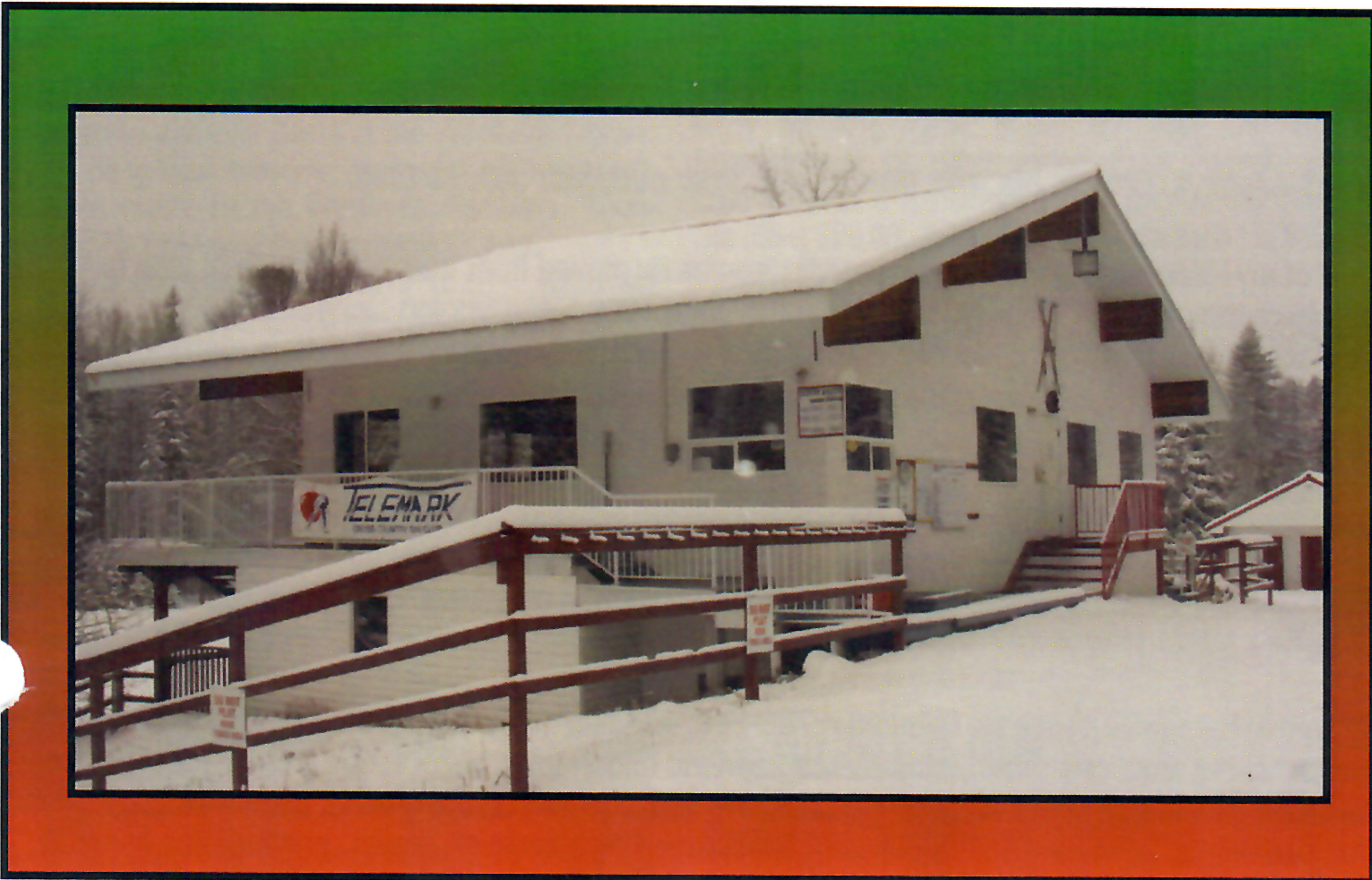

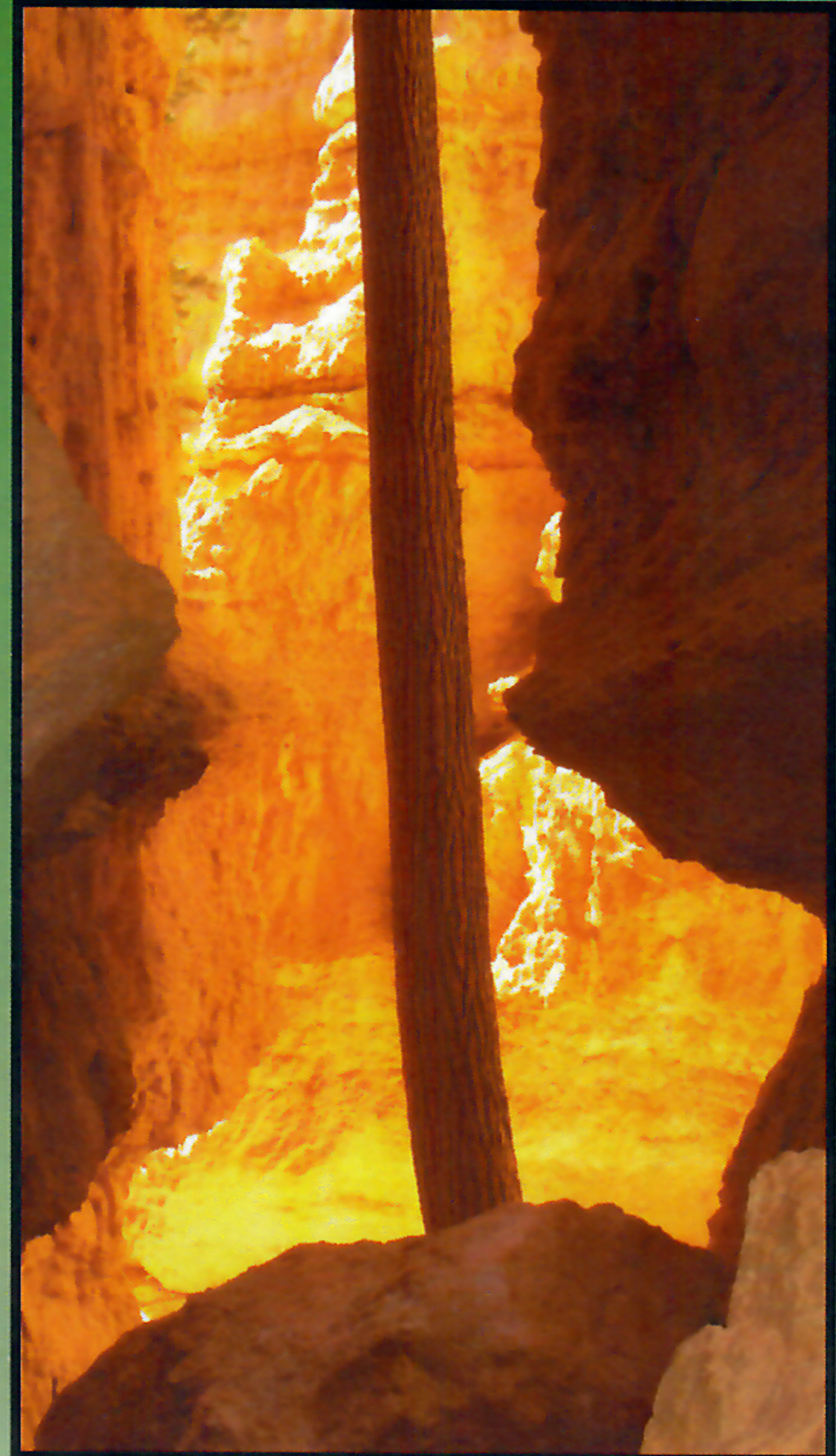


Telemark Cross Country Ski Club before the rush!

Only a day after Remembrance Day, snow started to accumulate above Glenrosa at the entranceway to the Telemark cross country ski trails. The Cross Country Ski Club, "dedicated to fostering and promoting the sport of cross-country skiing," will be opening its doors in the next few weeks. A variety of passes are available: Day Pass: Youth \$5.00, Adult \$12.00; 5 Day Pass(any 5 days): Adult \$50.00; Night Skiing(4:00 pm-9:00 pm): Youth \$4.00, Adult \$5.00; Snowshoe Day Pass: \$5.00; Snowshoe Season Pass: \$52.00. Snowshoeing is Free for ski season pass holders. Season Pass after November 1st: Youth \$52.00, Adult \$145.00, Family \$340.00(Family pass for parents and children under 19 only). Ages as of December 31st. HST and \$10 fee/member to Cross Country BC included. There are also Adult Ski Lessons, School Programs, Skill Development programs, the Junior Racing Team, Biathlon programs, Special Olympics, and Rentals. Easy, Intermediate and Advanced trails meander throughout the property. Easy Trails include Squirrel Loop 1.46 km; Forest Lane 1.15 km; Memory Lane 1.0 km and Summer Road 0.50 km. Intermediate Trails are Rabbit Run 2.40 km and Telemark 6.8 km. Advanced Trails consist of Panorama Ridge 5.42 km; Fern Creek Trail 9.2 km; Crystal Rim 7.8 km; Connector 0.86 km; Cut-Off 0.62 km and Racing Trails 7.5 km. There are also approximately 40 km of snowshoe trails. "The mission of the Telemark Cross-Country Ski Club is to promote cross-country skiing, biathlon and snowshoeing as life-long sports, assist individuals with development of their skills, provide training for those wishing to take up competitive skiing and to make cross-country skiing fun and affordable for everyone!" Telemark Cross Country ski area is located approximately 10-15 minutes from downtown Westbank along the paved road to Crystal Mountain. 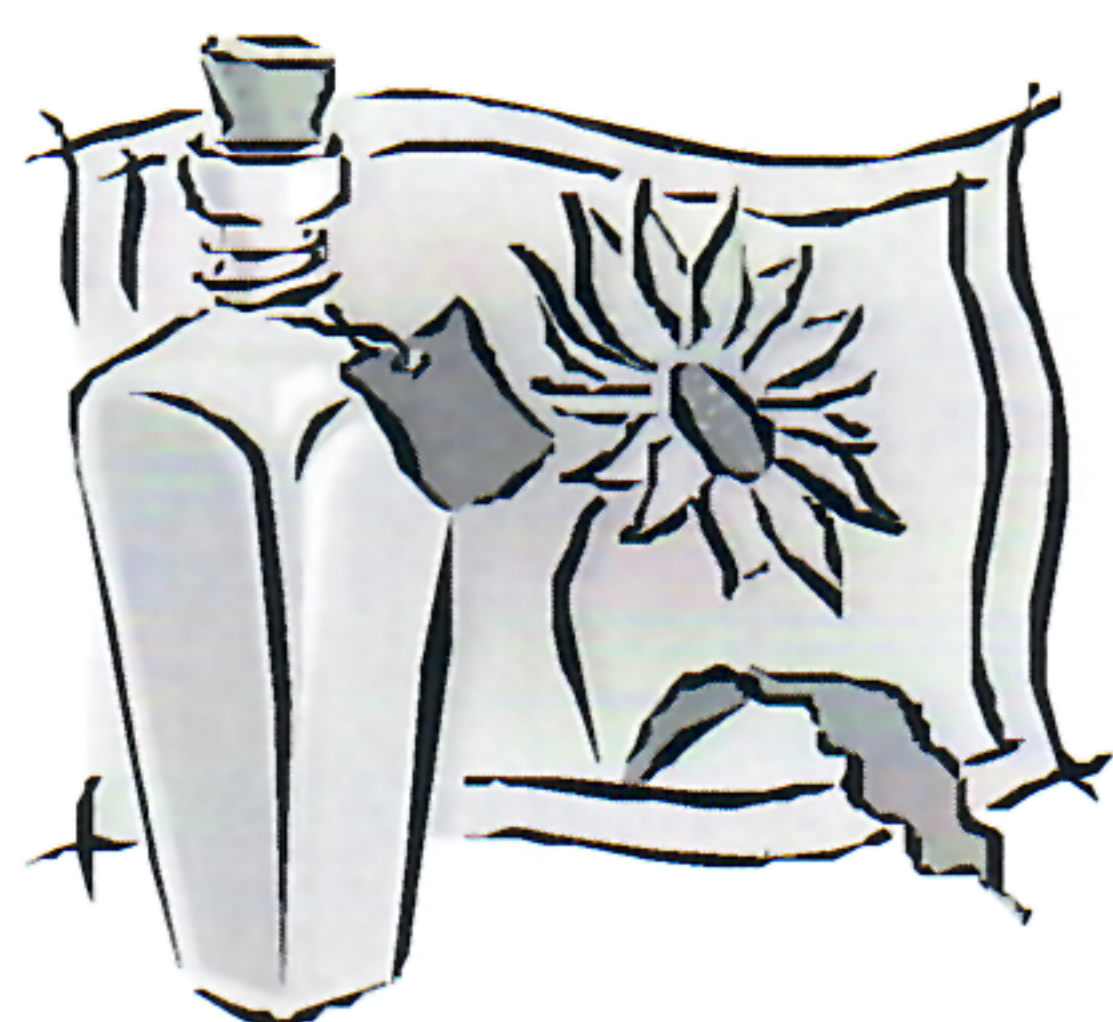

From the Kitchen Nook: Easy Perogi Casserole by Rita Pedersen

Ingredients: Nine lasagne noodles, uncooked, 4 cups hot mashed potatoes, 1/2 cup Herb & Garlic cream cheese spread, 6 green onions thinly sliced, 2 cups cheddar shredded cheese, divided, **Directions:** Heat oven to 375°F. Cook noodles as directed on package, omitting salt. Meanwhile, combine mashed potatoes, cream cheese spread, onions, and 1 cup cheddar. Place 3 noodles in 13x9-inch baking dish greased; cover with 1/3 of the potato mixture. Repeat layers twice. Top with remaining cheddar; cover. Bake 30 min. or until heated through. Uncover; bake 3 to 5 minutes or until cheddar is lightly browned. Let stand 10 min. before cutting to serve. Serve with a mixed green salad tossed with your favourite dressing. **How**

to Make the Mashed Potatoes: Peel 2 lb. (about 4) baking potatoes; add to large saucepan of boiling water. Cook 20 to 25 min. or until tender. Drain potatoes, reserving 1/2 cup of the cooking water. Return potatoes to pan; mash until smooth. For extra creamy potatoes, add 1/4 to 1/2 cup of the reserved cooking water to the potatoes when mashing them. For a change of pace, substitute cottage cheese for the mashed potatoes.

John A. Brown, Westbank Pioneer and Entrepreneur, Part 1 by Gordon H. Ficke

"To the best of my knowledge," John Brown recalls, "my family moved from their half section of land in Morris, Manitoba, where they farmed, to settle in Peachland in June 1909." Washington, John's father, was born in 1862 on the Isle of Man. Kathleen, his mother, was born on the family estate, 'Oaklawn', in King's County, Ireland. "My mother's family, the Drought's, had moved to the Peachland area earlier." Drought's Hill on Highway 97 was named after them.

Shortly after they arrived, Albert Drought, a carpenter, built the Brown house on Elliott Road in Westbank. Drought commuted from Trepanier to Westbank on foot during the year it took to build the house. The ten-acre parcel where the house was built was initially covered in Ponderosa pine trees with trunks two feet in diameter. Local natives cleared the timber and the logs went to Hitchner Bros. Sawmill in Glenrosa.

John was born in the family house on February 27th, 1915 and has many memories growing up there. One that stands out is the time, one winter, when he and a friend undertook a major renovation project. The front of the house stood on five-foot posts, while at the back, the house rested on the ground. John was about fifteen at the time, dug almost all the basement out using a horse pulling a scraper. Brown constructed a concrete foundation and created a 3/4 basement. His good friend Frank Browne (no relation) helped him with the project.

Frank would often live with the family during the winter. The Westbank Legion, Branch 288, purchased the property in recent years, and several years ago the house was torn down.

Once the land was cleared and the house built, the Browns planted an orchard with cherry, pear and apple trees. Ten crab apple trees stood on the property for many years. John and Washington ran the farm together for a number of years. They purchased more land and orchards in Westbank to expand their farming operation. In 1930 they purchased the Gellatly farm. This was a vast holding that formerly encompassed all the flat land from the south end of Whitworth Road to the north where the public beach and Angus Drive are today.

"When World War II came," John related, "my two brothers talked me into staying home to help dad with the farm."

The family operated their own fruit packinghouse on the Gellatly property for a number of years and transported their fruit via a CN barge that ran the length of Okanagan Lake. That changed when the Westbank Co-op and dock (formerly located next to The Point at the mouth of Powers Creek) was built. The fruit was loaded on railway cars and then transported by barges. Farming was not a sustainable occupation, even back in those days. John logged timber but his back was giving him severe problems. While in his early thirties, he made an appointment with his doctor to see if his back issue could be rectified. The doctor informed John that he could have an operation but oftentimes these types of operations weren't successful.

"Why don't you get a job where you can walk on a level surface," the doctor advised him. Brown took his advice and was hired at the Westbank Co-op Packinghouse where he was quickly promoted to foreman. He had that job for three or four years. His son Doug also worked for him there.

In those early years the farm was losing money and the Browns owed the federal and provincial government taxes on their properties. John made an arrangement to work for the Provincial Highways Department. As he owned a truck, Bill Miller the road foreman would put him to work any time they required his services.

In 1947 Washington passed away and a new chapter in Brown's life was about to begin.
