Taneda Karate Dojo Results at the Chito-ryu World Championships by Chris Taneda The Taneda Karate Dojo captured 14 Gold, 19 Silver and 28 Bronze medals at the 10th Soke Cup in Kumamoto Japan this past August. Over 500 competitors partook in the triannual World Championships for the



Chito-ryu style of karate. Along with the 61 medals, Glen Kirk was awarded the Male Grand Champion and Michelle Taneda defended her Grand Championship by winning the female award for the 2nd consecutive time. Michelle captured Silver in women's black belt kata (forms), Bronze in individual kumite (sparring), Silver in team Kumite and Bronze in team kata. Taneda was the only woman in the black belt division to medal in all four events. it was an easy decision to award her the Female Grand Championship. Glen Kirk won Gold in masters (40+) Kata and Kumite. He also won Bronze in men's team kumite. Sensei Glen won the kumite division in 1992 when all the black belts fought in one weight division not 2, so winning that was a big accomplishment. In 1998 the winners of the light weight and heavy weight divisions were put into an open division which Sensei Glen won again proving that he was the best fighter at the tournament. This is his first Soke Cup as Grand Champion. The Taneda dojo had four other members that also won four medals. Danielle Kumalae won 2 Gold & 2 Silver medals, Coulson Boothe won one 1 Gold & 3 Silver and Claire Boothe won 1 Gold & 3 Silver, Jessica Lotoski won 3 Silver & 1 Bronze medal. Triple medalists were Anne Ross 2 Gold & 1 Bronze, Elizabeth Tribe 1 Gold & 2 Bronze, Kari Taneda 1 Gold 1 Silver & 1 Bronze, Meranda Lloyd 1 Gold & 2 Bronze Ellen Tribe 2 Silver & 1 Bronze, Emily Tribe 1 Silver & 2 Bronze, Raphaela Russo 3 Bronze. Water is the Lifeline for Orchard Farmers! by Gordon Ficke

Stan Taneda, long-time Westbank orchardist, recalls the labour intensive method of irrigating their tomatoes and fruit trees.



They required a continuous and abundant supply of water. "The irrigation ditch system was something else," Stan, remembers. The Westbank Irrigation District brough the water to the highest point of your property and from there the orchardist was responsible for carving a distribution system of ditches to the various highest points within the property so that all the fruit trees and tomato plants would receive adequate water. As a young man Stan was responsible for keeping the water in those ditches flowing freely in all directions on their hillside property. "Gravity was working against you," Taneda admitted. "It was a chore, and it seemed like, at that young age that we were working out there from sun-up to sun-down!" The water bailiff from the Westbank Irrigation District, Pat Hewlett, policed the system on behalf of the orchard ists. A gate situated in the tin flume leading to the various orchards monitored the water flow for each user. "You were allowed a predetermined amount of inches coming through the gate," Stan remembers. "Most orchardists bent the rules and took a

little bit more water than they were allegedly allowed. There were no fines issued in those days, as all the farmers knew and respected each other. "We were always fighting for more water." Taneda laughingly adds, "There was always a bottle of home made beer in the water tank for the water bailiff!"
